CSM FELDMAN IS WINNER FOR TEXAS IN EXTRA INNINGS; CONTINUES SHUTOUT STREAK

Scott Feldman, who was drafted by Texas out of College of San Mateo following his 2003 All-America season for the Bulldogs, continued his near perfect post-season play Wednesday night to earn the extra-inning win for the Rangers in Game 4 of the ALCS.

Feldman left nobody on base in his one inning of relief, the 10th, and was rewarded when Texas struck for four runs in the top of the 11th. He has now pitched 5 1/3 innings of shutout baseball this week, figuring in two victories.

On Monday, Feldman had Major League Baseball's longest postseason relief shutout stint of the 21st Century, 4 1/3 innings. Nobody had thrown four or more innings of shutout relief since 1999 and only two people had done it over the past 20 years.

Burlingame High grad Feldman was undefeated in his two regular seasons at CSM and 25-2 overall, the only setbacks coming in the California Community College Athletic Association State Final Four.
