Hall of Fame Paul Carmazzi

Sacramento City College

Paul's coaching career at Sacramento City College covered 28 consecutive seasons. During this time, he served in numerous capacities, including assistant coach, co-head coach, and head coach.

During his 28-year career, his overall won loss record totals an astounding 1056 wins with 279 losses and 12 ties for 78% winning percentage. During this time, Sacramento City College captured three Sate Championships, 1988, 1998, and 1999. The 1998 team was also crowned the mythical National Champion by Baseball America. The Panthers were also able to capture 21 Conference Championships and compete in 12 State Championship tournaments.

Sacramento City College has always been about its players, the accomplishments of the individual players during Paul's tenure at SCC are remarkable. Twenty-seven players reached the major leagues during this time while hundreds others transferred to four year schools all over the United States

In 1984, head coach Jerry Weinstein took a leave of absence to become an assistant coach at the University of Miami. During this time, Paul took over as the head coach and led the team to the State Championship game. Although they lost the game, that team came through the loser's bracket and won 5 consecutive. That team featured 4 future major leaguers including Greg Vaughn and Jeff Blauser, who would eventually both play in a World Series.

Many of Paul's greatest contributions to the program have come off of the field. He has served as either the Athletic Director or the Athletic Coordinator every year since 1992. During this time, he has worked under 3 deans and worked through massive budget cuts, increased growth, Title IX, and the creation of our state of the art fitness center. He has chaired the campus budget committee and has been an integral part of the overall campus.

Possibly his two biggest accomplishments away from the field are the building of Union Stadium and the creation of the SCC Baseball Camp. Union Stadium remains one of the best community college facility in the state and was built in 1987 by the local unions under the direction of Jerry Weinstein and Paul Carmazzi. The 2,000 seat stadium

has hosted many events, including the State Championships in 1989, 1991, and 1993. SCC Baseball Camp started under Paul's direction in 1983 and continues to serve kids of all ages through Winter, Summer, and Spring Break Camps.

Paul has also worked as a professional scout for the California Angels and the Kansas City Royals. He served on the CCCBCA Executive Council from 1999-2005 and has also coached at the high school and American Legion levels.

Paul and his wife Karen have three children, Paul, Megan, and Ann Marie.
