As you know, we have been having great discussions about repeatability. These discussions continue to be at the basic "discovery" stage at this point. Although the Academic Senate did come up with resolutions on the topic, we continue to work with the language and vetting it through several committees. At this point, I do not see this going to Consultation Council until late spring, at best. With that time frame, full implementation could be as much as two years from now.

I tell you this because I am getting questions and suggestions that colleges are already trying to predict what the language will say so that they can start changing curriculum. I think it would be highly premature for anyone to make changes to schedules, catalogs, or curriculum based on any predictions of where the repeatability language might be going. If you are making those changes because of priority issues or other pragmatic issues on your campus, I would understand...but please do not adjust your curriculum unnecessarily at this point.

Keep up the good work you are doing! I look forward to seeing everyone later this spring.
