#### **Cosumnes River Holds On, Stays Alive for Another Game Tonight**

College of the Siskiyous and Cosumnes River kicked off day two of the State Championship tournament Saturday afternoon in an elimination game. The teams were vying for the right to keep their season alive and take on the loser of the upcoming Cypress and Mt. Sac game. Despite giving up an early lead, Cosumnes River took the lead and was able to hold on through the end for a 3-2 win.

Siskiyous picked up the first run of the day in the top of the first. Freshman outfielder Krystal Huffman doubled and reached third and then scored off an illegal pitch call to give the Eagles a 1-0 lead. Cosumnes River came right back at the Eagles in the top of the second taking advantage of Siskiyous errors and an RBI single by freshman first baseman Janelle Wisdom to take the 2-1 lead.

The Hawks extended their lead in the third. Sophomore shortstop April Isbell singled and stole second and then scored after two ground-outs extend the CRC lead to two.

After three scoreless innings Siskiyous had its last shot in the bottom of the seventh to make up two runs. The Eagles led off with two straight singles and suffered an out with a fielder's choice. A single by sophomore designated player Janelle Cromie and an error scored a run for Siskiyous cutting the lead to one. After a walk, the bases were loaded with no outs. Sophomore pitcher Jordyn Brown lined one out to left and the Eagles runners made a mental error continuing to run as Cosumnes River left fielder Rebecka Schneider threw to third for the double play to end the game in CRC's favor.

Cosumnes River pitcher Brittany McCrum earned the win allowing just one earned run in six innings of work to improve to 11-2. Sophomore pitcher Breann McGraw came in to pitch in the seventh for the save, her first this year. Sophomore pitcher Jordyn Brown suffered the loss for Siskiyous ending her season 15-9 striking out three in three innings. Freshman Vanessa Bodily pitched the final four innings for the Eagles striking out three and allowing just two hits.

Cosumnes River (31-15) keeps its season alive and will move on to action tonight facing the loser of the Cypress and Mt. Sac game. Siskiyous ends its season 28-13 after going two-and-out at the State Championship Tournament.
