Crowd Braves Elements At Championship:

MT. SAN ANTONIO EDGES SAN MATEO, 7-6, FOR TITLE

San Mateo -- Notes on the final 2009 official California Community College Football Coaches Association state poll, as compiled by the JC Athletic Bureau:

Mt. San Antonio College wrapped up the state championship and the top spot in the final poll with a 7-6 victory over host College of San Mateo in the California Community College Athletic Association championship game on Dec. 12. (By agreement, the CCCFCA awards the top two poll positions to the state finalists.)

Mt. SAC quarterback Matt Faulkner completed a 64-yard touchdown pass play to freshman wide receiver Michael Harrell at the end of the third quarter and Jeremy Brown converted from the 25-yard line (after a penalty) to provide the margin of victory before a crowd of more than 3,000 on a rainy afternoon.

Northern California champ San Mateo (10-2) had kept the Mounties (13-1) in check until that point, holding a 6-0 lead.

The Bulldogs went 80 yards on their first possession, mostly on the running of David Aknin (who had 129 yards in the game). Quarterback Matt Pelesasa got the final yard on a bootleg, rolling untouched to the right side of the end zone. CSM couldn't get the conversion kick attempt off, however, on the wet (artificial turf) field. Both San Mateo season losses were by a single point.
