**Mt. SAC is state runner-up again:**

**BUTTE FINISHES AS USA'S LONE UNBEATEN**

**San Mateo -- Butte College** swept 2008 football honors, completing the only undefeated season among the USA's 142 teams with a 17-9 victory over **Mt. San Antonio** in the California Community College Athletic Association championship game on Dec. 13 at Orange Coast College in Costa Mesa – with a crowd of 4,123 watching.

The Roadrunners (12-0) from Oroville are No.1 and Mt. SAC (12-2) is No. 2 (for the second straight year) in the final official California Community College Football Coaches Association state poll, as compiled by the JC Athletic Bureau.

The CCCFCA automatically awards the top two spots in the final ratings to the winner and runner-up in the state championship game.

Butte Coach Jeff Jordan took both California and National (American Football Coaches Association) CC Coach of the Year honors.
