



**Hanford, CA** - The 2011 CCCAA Women's Golf Championships went down to the wire as Taylor Crandall birdied the final hole of the tournament giving Palomar a one stroke victory over Glendale College. Palomar erased a four stroke lead behind the second rounds of Taylor Crandall, and Meghan Hardin who took off a combined 11 strokes from their first round.

In one of the closest State Tournaments ever, Glendale lead after the first round with six strokes separating the first three teams (Glendale 325, Palomar 329, and Sacramento 331).

Individually Ya-Ting Yang was the only person to shoot under par with a 71, only to be disqualified when she signed her scorecard with a wrong score. Yang, after her scorecard was signed and turned in she realized that she actually shot a 72 instead of 71. She came back to the official scorer's table with the mistake, only to find out she would be disqualified. The lead then fell to College of the Canyons Kris Grimes who shot a 76. Grimes won the Individual State Honors with a 155 two round score two strokes over Glendale's Hanna Lee. Third through fifth was decided by a tie breaker as Taylor Crandall (Palomar), Pattaporn Silwana (Glendale), and Nicole Bullemer (CCSB) finished with scores of 158. Sacramento's Riley Sexton rounded out the top six with a 160.
