- Practice:** Practice rounds on the SCGA Course are available at a college rate of \$35. Please contact Pat Kimball to schedule practice times. He can be reached at 951-677-8780 Ext 1. Book times for student-athletes will take place between 1:00 pm and 2:00 pm on Sunday, May 9th. Price for that is \$45 per player. That cost may be reduced if the CCCGCA is able to collect membership dues to offset the practice expense.

Conduct: Student-athletes and coaches are reminded that unsportsmanlike conduct will not be tolerated. Penalties may be imposed to participating student-athletes and coaches if they violate the COA Decorum policy.

Alcohol & Tobacco: The consumption of any alcoholic drinks or the use of tobacco products is strictly prohibited.

Supervision: Student-athletes shall be accompanied and supervised throughout the regional competition by an employee from the college. Lacking this supervision, participation shall be denied.

Format/Tee-Times: Thirty six holes of medal play. Par 72 - 6880 yards.
Tee-off at 7:00 am on holes 1 and 10.
Play from the **Black Tees** with the exception of holes:
2, 3, 14, 18 (from the **Blue Tees**)
Hole #10 will be played from the **White Tees**.
Play in threesomes.

Spectators: Spectators are allowed on the golf course however, they must remain on the cart paths or in the rough. They are not permitted to walk or talk with the competitors during the competition and must follow the club's dress policy. Golf carts are **NOT** available to spectators.

Athletic Training: Athletic trainers from Palomar College and Riverside Community College will be available to student-athletes that need medical care.

Competition Rules:

One ball rule – One ball rule is **NOT** in effect during this competition.
Cell phones – Use of cell phones during play is not allowed. Players will be given a warning/2 stroke penalty/disqualification.

Electronic devices – No electronic devices are allowed during play (i.e. range finders, beepers, pagers etc.)

- One (1) designated Coach can coach players from tee to green, excluding hazards, bunkers, and putting greens.
- It is required that each player walks and carries his own bag of clubs throughout the tournament.
- There will be no substitutions after the start of each post-conference tournament.
- Participants in all regional and state championship events shall dress in proper golf attire, in slacks or appropriate length shorts according to course regulation, and shirts with a collar. Players will be disqualified from that day of competition in which they do not wear the proper attire.

When ties occur, the qualifiers shall be determined as follows:

- A. Team Ties – If any tie/ties occur, the scorecards of the best 5-of-6 players on each tied team or tied individuals will be “matched” using the USGA rules listed below:
The winner shall be determined by comparing the scores of those five (5) golfers whose scores created the tie in the order below until the tie is broken:
1. The final 18 holes
 2. The final 9 holes
 3. The final 6 holes
 4. The final 3 holes
 5. The 18th hole
- B. Individual Ties – As in team ties, the tie breaking process is determined by matching scorecards as outlined above.

The SCGA pace of play policy will be used and enforced – Players could be put on the clock if they are out of position/or not keeping up with pace of play.

Coaches must make sure their players are at the first tee for their tee time at least 10 minutes before the required time. Players late for their tee-off will be penalized two (2) strokes. After 5 minutes the late player will be disqualified.
