

In the second half, Foothill managed to tie the game, and eventually take the lead

for good at 51-49, with 6:06 remaining on a driving lay-up by scoring leader Jasmine Lowe. She followed with a 3-point goal, leading the Owls on an 18-7 run to the end.

Pasadena, which was forced to foul down the stretch, saw Foothill make seven free throws in the final minute to turn back the Lancers, who finish the season 29-6. A year ago, Pasadena, which has never won a state championship in women's basketball, lost in the finals to Mt. San Antonio.

For Foothill it will be its first appearance in the finals.

Pasadena had four players-Kieisha Phelps (15), Easter Faafiti (13), Anna Magganas (12) and Lynette Jacobs (11)-score in double figures. Foothill countered with 22 points from Jasmine Lowe and 13 from Ashley Marshall.
