CCSF Moves To Top As Mt. San Antonio's National Leading Streak Ends

San Mateo -- Notes on the 2011 official California Community College Football Coaches Association state poll, as compiled by the JC Athletic Bureau:

San Mateo (Sept. 26, 2011) – City College of San Francisco moved up a spot to No. 1 this week after 2-time defending state champion Mt. San Antonio College saw its national leading community college football win streak stopped at 26 games by Riverside, 29-26 over the weekend.

CCSF (3-0) took 22 of the 25 first place votes from representatives of the California Community College Football Coaches Association to stay ahead of unbeaten Butte and Saddleback. Riverside moved up to No. 4.

This Saturday CCSF visits No. 12 De Anza (3-0), which just upset rival and formerly No. 4 Foothill, 21-20. Butte hosts Redwoods and Saddleback entertains Cerritos.
