MT. SAC RETAINS STATE & NATIONAL FOOTBALL CROWNS; DEFEATS CCSF, 34-7

Walnut, Calif. – Mt San Antonio College successfully defended its California Community College Athletic Association football championship Saturday, turning back 5-time champion City College of San Francisco 34-7, in front of a partisan crowd of 7,460 at Hilmer Lodge Stadium

It was also a mythical national championship battle of the USA two remaining major unbeaten JC/CC teams, ranked 1 (MSAC) & 2 (CCSF) in the country. Mt. SAC finished with the best record (13-0 of any of the nation's 140 teams and as champion of the largest 2-year college association (71 teams) in claiming the mythical national crown ahead of the Rams (11-1). Mt. SAC increased its national-leading win streak to 23 games

Mt. SAC All-America quarterback Nick Lamaison completed 23 of 33 passes for 223 yards to earn player of the game honors. Mounties wide receiver Michael Edwards was the offensive player of the game with 6 catches for 67 yards and a TD. Defensive player of the game honors went to Mt. SAC lineman Boja Filimoeatu (6-2, 250), with 8 tackles (6 unassisted), including two sacks.

Mt. SAC scored on its first possession, on Marcus Wagner's 20-yard run, and didn't let up en route to a 27-0 halftime lead. CCSF had a chance to get back into the game in the third quarter, driving 80 yards after an interception in the end zone by Nigel Malone; then recovering a fumble in Mountie territory on the ensuing kickoff.

A 5-yard pass from Steele Jantz to Josh Fate put the Rams on the board with 6:04 left in the period. But CCSF could not capitalize on the second opportunity. Mt. SAC then drove for the game's final score with 1:35 remaining in the third quarter – Lamaison's TD toss to Edwards.

CCSF All-America quarterback Jantz, the state co-player of the year with Lamaison, had nearly identical yardage, 224, completing 21 of 48 attempts. Each QB was intercepted twice.

But Jantz was sacked eight times and Lamaison did not get caught. San Francisco's Natay Adjei was the game's top receiver with 8 catches for 84 yards.

Brice McBride of Mt. SAC was the top rusher with 78 yards on 26 carries and scored twice. Kenny Haynes led the Rams with 54 yards on 14 rushes.

It was the third state football crown for Mt. SAC, which is 3-2 in title games. CCSF is 5-6 in 11 finals appearances. CCSF defeated Mt. SAC, 31-28, for the 2007 championship, led by QB Jeremiah Masoli.

Cam Newton fourth JC transfer to win Heisman; still seeking an overall national title however...

Blinn College (Texas) won the **2009 NJCAA** championship behind 2010 Heisman Trophy winner **Cam Newton** of **Auburn**.

But **Mt. SAC** was the overall 2009 mythical National JC/CC champion, ahead of Blinn.

So Newton is still aiming for his first overall national title in this season's BCS championship game.
