Women's Soccer: National Player of the Year Jents to continue career at Louisville

2002 NSCAA/adidas National Junior College Women's Soccer Player of the Year Kim Jents has signed a national letter of intent to continue her athletic and academic career at the University of Louisville.

Also moving on to four-year universities are defender Sarah Chifcian (University of San Diego) and forward Ana Coria (Cal State Fullerton).

All three helped LBCC win two California Community College championships and the program's first national championship this year. In their two seasons, the Lady Vikings had a combined record of 48-1-1.

Jents (Canyon HS), who leaves LBCC as the school's all-time leading goal scorer (67) and points leader (170), was also heavily recruited by Florida, Xavier, Florida State, Miami, UCLA, and Montana.

This past season, Chifcian (Rosary HS) filled the sweeper position once held by All-American Cheech Gibson and helped the Lady Vikings post 17 shutouts. Chifcian was a first-team All-SCC pick in 2002.

Coria (Kennedy HS), a second-team All-South Coast Conference selection, was the team's second leading scorer in 2002 with 15 goals and 10 assists, third on the squad with 45 points.

"Getting the kids to move on is what it's all about," said LBCC head coach Mauricio Ingrassia. "By using soccer as a tool, it can help them succeed at the next level. I'm extremely proud of these three. They helped Long Beach City College achieve some amazing feats. They will succeed at the next level."
