**S1 Cypress College 5, N1 American River College 0**

Sophomore Cathi Dragna and freshman Katelyn Krauss both scored twice to lead Cypress College to a 5-0 rout over American River College on Sunday to claim the 204 Citi California Community Colleges Commission on Athletics Women's Soccer Championship.

Cold and rainy conditions at the Oxnard College soccer complex aided in keeping the game scoreless for the opening 30 minutes of play.

The Chargers held the ball on ARC's side of the field for a majority of the game and outshot the Beavers by a 21-1 margin.

But once the Chargers got their first goal, the game and the college's third state championship were securely theirs.

Dragna headed in a corner kick from Beth Wagenhoffer in the 31<sup>st</sup> to open the scoring for Cypress.

Four minutes later (35<sup>th</sup> minute), Krystle Vance scored her lone goal of the game off an amazing shot from nearly 30 feet out. After a quick pass from Katelyn Krauss, Vance's shot sailed past American River goal keeper Hannah Martinez, hit off the bottom of the crossbar and bounced just past the goal line to put Cypress up 2-0.

Krauss got the first of her two goals just before time expired in the first half. Krauss earned a breakaway goal in the 45<sup>th</sup> minute to give the Chargers a commanding 3-0 halftime lead.

Not to be outdone, Dragna blasted her own long-range shot for her second goal in the 57<sup>th</sup> minute. Heather Miller picked up her second assist of the game after feeding Dragna with a one-time pass that she nailed from 25 feet deep for the 4-0 lead

Wagenhoffer earned her second corner kick assist in the 77<sup>th</sup> minute when she fed Krauss for her close-range goal to close the game scoring for the Chargers.

Freshmen Deanna Lindley (45 minutes) Danielle Carty (40 min.) and Sarah Balderas (5 min.) combined in goal for Cypress' fifth shutout of the postseason.

Martinez totaled five saves in goal for the Beavers in the losing effort. American River closes the season with a 19-2-3 overall record.

The 2004 season was an emotional one for the Chargers with the passing of former head coach Ray Haas. The season and the newly acquired state championship were dedicated in his memory.

Cypress closes its season with a 22-1-1 overall record. Following the game, Vance and Wagenhoffer were named State Tournament Co-Most Valuable Players.
