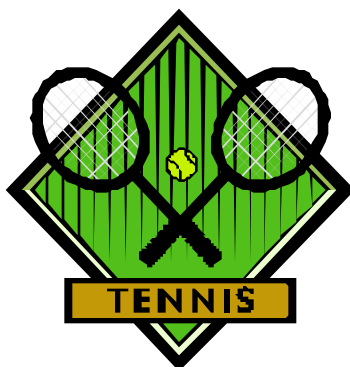

2001 STATE TEAM CHAMPIONSHIPS
THURSDAY, MAY 10, 2001 / AMERICAN RIVER COLLEGE

- Entry Fee:** No entry fee is charged, thanks to the sponsorship of Wilson Racquet Sports. Wilson has also provided the balls used in the championships at no cost.
- Format:** North Regional Team Champions play the South Regional Team Champions, for a Men's and a Women's State Team Championship. The same format is used for the men's and women's matches: nine possible points, with one point awarded for each of 6 singles matches won, and one point for each of 3 doubles matches won. Matches are best 2 out of 3 sets; the singles matches are played first. The first team to reach 5 points wins the contest; the remaining matches need not be played.
- Lineups:** Per COA Tennis Supplement, the line up shall be the same as that used in the Regional Team Championship. (See 18.7.3.B. 1-6)
- Trainer:** A trainer will be available on site, beginning at 9:00 a.m. Please bring your own training supplies.
- Shower Facilities:** Shower facilities are available to tournament participants. Please bring your own towels.
- Racquet Stringing:** No stringing services are available at the college.
- Practice Courts:** Practice courts will be available at 9:00 a.m.--coaches will be assigned courts for their teams at the tournament desk.
- Meeting with Officials, Players, and Coaches:**
For the men, 10:15 a.m. at the Tournament Desk. For the women the meeting will be held at 12:45 p.m. At this time, a brief review of the rules covering State Team Championship play will be conducted, along with introductions of players, coaches, and officials. Coaches should familiarize their players with the rules contained in the 2000-01 edition of the COA Tennis Supplement.

2001 STATE SINGLES AND DOUBLES CHAMPIONSHIPS
FRIDAY AND SATURDAY, MAY 11 AND 12 AT THE BROADSTONE RACQUET CLUB

Entry Fee: **Singles, \$35; Doubles, \$35/team. Bring your check or cash for the entry fee to the tournament desk before the first round of play in singles or in doubles.**

Checks payable to: ARC ATHLETIC TENNIS TRUST

Format: Separate singles and doubles tournaments, 16 draw, single-elimination, all matches are best 2 out of 3 sets.

Qualifiers: The top 8 singles players and top 8 doubles teams from the North regional tournaments and from the South regional tournaments play for a Men's and a Women's State Singles Championship and State Doubles Championship. In the first round, players from the North will meet players from the South.

Trainer: A trainer will be available on site, beginning at 8 a.m. Please bring your own training supplies.

Shower facilities: Shower facilities are available to tournament participants; please bring your own towels.

Racquet Stringing: Stringing services will be available at the Club.

Practice Courts: Practice courts will be available at 8 a.m. Courts are not available on Wednesday or Thursday.

Check-in time: Mandatory check in at the tournament desk at least 15 minutes before your scheduled match time.

Highway 5 south to Highway 80
Highway 80 east (to Reno)
Take Madison Avenue off ramp (to the Right)
Proceed two (2) stop lights to College Oak Drive
Right on College Oak. ARC is on the left.

Enter Stadium parking lot. Lot near courts will be reserved for our use.
Permits will be provided.

From Sacramento Airport to Broadstone Racquet Club

Highway 5 south into Sacramento.
Follow signs for South Lake Tahoe-Highway 50
Highway 50 to Prairie City Road.
Go left and over Highway 50 to Iron Point Road
Right on Iron Point Road.
Left on Oak Avenue.
Right on Halidon to the Club.
