**Game Recap:** Golden West's Marko Madaras, a freshman, scored in the first three-minute overtime period, and Paul Miernicki and Spencer Van Horne had two key steals in the final minute as the Rustlers downed Long Beach City, 9-8, in overtime in the finals of the Southern California Championship match at Riverside City College. Both teams will advance to the CCCAA State Championship tournament next weekend at Cerritos College. Golden West, the south's top seed, figures to be the No. 1 seed when pairings are announced tomorrow for the state finals. The regional title is the 13th consecutive for Golden West, who has won four state titles since 2001, and the 10th straight for current Rustler head coach Scott Taylor. This was the third meeting between these two programs and it didn't disappoint as Long Beach (23-3) jumped out to a 4-1 lead, but watched as the Rustlers ran off three straight goals, tying the match at 4-4 after the first quarter. The match remained tied at halftime, 6-6, after the third, 7-7 and at the regulation, 8-8. In the first overtime period, with Golden West on the attack, Madaras received the ball out front of the cage and skipped a shot under the arm Long Beach goalie Vince Ward.

**Game Recap:** In one of the tournament's better matches, Cuesta scored five of the last seven goals as the Cougars won the third-place game at the Southern California Championships at Riverside City College, 10-8, over Grossmont. Tied 7-7 after with 7:14 left in the match, Cuesta (24-10) scored back-to-back goals to take a 9-7 lead. After Grossmont scored to get within one, Cuesta's Luka Vukomanovic sealed the win with a goal at the 2:19 mark. The loss overshadowed an outstanding performance by Grossmont's Trey Davis, a sophomore, who scored six of the Griffins' eight goals, including at one-point five straight. Cuesta was led by Eric Marsh who scored four goals, two coming on penalty shots. Grossmont finishes the season 22-7.

After falling behind 2-0, Golden West, the south's top seed in the Southern California Water Polo Championship, went on an eight-goal binge in routing Grossmont, 15-7 in a semifinal match at Riverside City College. Golden West advances to the finals where the Rustlers will meet the winner of the Long Beach City-Cuesta match at 2:45 pm. Regardless of the outcome of the finals. Golden West has punched their ticket to the CCCAA State Championship tournament with the final appearance. At one point in the match, Golden West had scored 12 of the 14 goals scores and things turned worse for Grossmont when starting goalie Bryan Cook was ejected with seconds remaining in the third quarter. **Game Recap:** A big second-half helped Long Beach City punch its' ticket to the CCCAA State Championships next week at Cerritos College and a chance at winning the Southern California Championship after the Vikings rolled off seven second-half goals on its way to a 12-9 victory over Cuesta in a semifinal game at the regional tournament. Cuesta (23-11) will play Grossmont in the third-place game at 1:30 pm. Meanwhile, Long Beach will take on top-seed Golden West at 2:45 pm for the regional title. Cuesta started quickly and scored three of the final four goals of the second half, taking a 6-4-halftime lead. But the second half easily belonged to Long Beach City (23-2). The Vikings outscored Cuesta, 7-1 over the course of 12 minutes of the second-half to take control of the match. Cuesta managed to score two goals in the final two minutes of the final quarter, but it wasn't nearly enough. Chase McColl, who scored five goals, three coming in the second half, led Long Beach in scoring. Teammate Zlatko Vlastic added three. Cuesta got three goals apiece from Dragan Dincic and Eric Marsh.

Riverside, which has lost just once this season, to Golden West, got five goals from freshman Brooke Koralewski. She scored three of Riverside's first six goals, including one at 3:54 of the second quarter that gave the Tigers (29-1) a 6-1 lead. Golden West couldn't muster any offense against sophomore goalie Andrea Antonissen. The Rustlers scored a goal in each of the final quarters, but Riverside turned Golden West back with three goals in the final half. Antoniseen stopped 17 Rustler shots.

**Game Recap:** Riverside sophomore goalie Andrea Antonissen stopped 11 shots on goal as she and the rest of the Riverside City Tigers advance to the finals of the Southern California Water Polo Championships with an 8-3 victory over No. 4 seed Long Beach City. With the win, the Tigers (28-1) also qualify for the CCCAA State Championship tournament next weekend at Cerritos College. Riverside is the defending state-champions. The appearance in the regional final will be the Tigers' eight straight appearance. Riverside is 5-3 all-time in the finals, having won the last four. Riverside, the No. 1 seed, will take on the winner of the Golden West-Cerritos winner at 4 pm at the Riverside City College Aquatic Center. In the win over Long Beach City, Riverside scored the matches' first three goals and two of the next three as the Tigers opened a 5-1 lead at halftime. In the second half, after a Long Beach City (19-10) goal, Riverside ran off three straight goals to put the game out of reach. Riverside had three players - Brooke Koralewski, Caroline Teets, Tara Scheibeler - score two goals apiece. Christine MacLennan scored all three Vikings goals.

**Game Recap:** It will be an all-Orange Empire Conference final in the women's championship game of the Southern California Water Polo Championships as #2 Golden West advanced to the finals where the Rustlers will meet top-seed Riverside at 4 pm at the Tigers' Aquatic Center. Golden West advanced after downing #3 seed Cerritos, 8-5. It will be the third meeting between Riverside and Golden West this season, with each having one once. The south's No. 1 seed at next week's CCCAA State Championship tournament will be on the line when they get in the pool. The appearance in the finals will be Golden West's first since 2003 when the Rustlers lost to Long Beach City. It is Riverside's eighth consecutive appearance and have a 5-3 record in the regional finals, winning the last four regional finals. Golden West got off to a fast start, taking a 5-3 halftime lead. Cerritos (27-4), however, cut the lead to 5-4 with 6:42 left in the third period, but the Falcons couldn't overcome the Rustlers (21-3) as they scored three of the final four goals to claim the victory. Golden West got three goals from Caitlin Gilmartin and two more from Gabriela Cabrera. Cerritos' Adriana Rodriguez and Katherine Gabayeron paced the Falcons with two goals. Cerritos will play Long Beach City for third-place at 5:15 pm.
