A. CALL TO ORDER & INTRODUCTIONS Dave Evans

The meeting was called to order and Management Council members were introduced. C. APPROVAL OF THE APRIL 2, 2009, MEETING MINUTES Dave Evans

It was moved, seconded, and carried (MSC) to approve the April 2, 2009, Management Council (MC) meeting minutes.

D. CHAIR UPDATE Dave Evans

Management Council Chair Dave Evans reported that the Management Council had met in a cost containment summit in Ontario on September 24-25 to review initial recommendations developed by the MC Competition Committee and ad hoc conferencing committees. The Management Council met again October 27-28 to finalize the cost containment recommendations that would be presented to the COA Board. Conferencing is a major part of cost containment, providing the greatest impact on budgets.

The California Community College Coaches Association (4CA) also met with the Management Council in a summit to discuss cost containment and other issues facing each sport.

CCCAA staff, Carlyle Carter, Jason Boggs, Rina Kasim George Mategakis, Rima Trotter, and Debra Wheeler were thanked for the support given to the COA/CCCAA. CCCAA Business Operations Specialist Rina Kasim was also thanked for her hard work in making all of the meeting room and catering arrangements with the Crowne Plaza Hotel for this COA/CCCAA Fall Conference.

E. COA BOARD REPORTJackie Fisher, Sr.

Jackie Fisher, Sr., has just begun his term as COA Board Chair and therefore had no report.

F. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT Carlyle Carter

CCCAA Executive Director Carlyle Carter reported that during the summer, the CCCADA, CCLC, CCC Chancellor's Office, and he worked together to lobby the California State Legislature regarding the State Budget, and cuts that were anticipated to affect California community college physical education programs.

The COA/CCCAA office tested a voting report system (iRespond), where MC members were able to cast votes electronically in a demonstrative session during the open forum. A printout showing how votes were recorded will be made available to the members who participated.

The CCCAA Online Exam is nearly ready. A program anomaly regarding emailed results is being addressed. Coaches' results will be emailed to their athletic directors. Athletic directors' results will be emailed to their commissioners. Commissioners and presidents' results will be emailed to the CCCAA Executive Director.

CCCAA Director of Championships George Mategakis has developed a five-year analysis of postconference competition costs and reimbursements, which was presented to the Management Council during the cost containment discussions in Ontario. He is hosting teleconferences for state championship event administration. Event managers are reporting that the teleconferences are of great assistance to their efforts.

The CCCAA is working to provide an infractions report to be posted to the www.coasports.org website.

The CCCAA Executive Director met with the NCAA Two-year Relations Committee and the Panel on Academic Reform is moving forward. It was reported that fewer athletes are matriculating to four-year colleges. Diane Dickman, NCAA Academic and Membership Affairs, met with CCCAA Executive Director Carlyle Carter. Ms. Dickman informed him that the NCAA is conducting a study which will include an Academic Progress Rate (APR) score for each NCAA member college. If a college's APR score is found to be low, it could lose scholarships. If the low APR score continues the following year, the result could be a loss of postconference competition. It is becoming increasingly important that California community college student athletes be prepared for success in order to be accepted to the four-year institutions.

The CCCAA now has an accurate map of the California community college districts that was developed from legal definitions using surveyors' records of district boundaries. The district map was displayed at the meeting, and a copy is now available on CDRom. This is a tool so that the membership can see their contiguous community college districts.

G. SPORT REPRESENTATIVE REPORTS

1. Badminton Jim Spillers

MC Badminton Representative Jim Spillers reported that even during this fiscal crisis, work is being done to cultivate the sport of badminton.

Congratulations were extended to Irvine Valley College for winning the 2009 CCCAA Badminton State Championship. The May 8-9, 2009, CCCAA Badminton State Championship was hosted by Irvine Valley College.

The May 14-15, 2010, CCCAA Badminton State Championship will be hosted by Pasadena City College.

2. Baseball Rod Beilby

MC Baseball Representative Rod Beilby congratulated Orange Coast College for winning the 2009 CCCAA Baseball State Championship.

The California Community College Baseball Coaches Association (CCCBCA) met September 11-12, 2009. Topics of discussion included further cost containment options (CCCBCA legislation to shorten the baseball season has already been approved by the COA Board), Stat Crew, and the development of a process for the evaluation of officials by the CCCBCA.

Congratulations were extended to the CCCAA Baseball All State Academic Team award recipients: Kelvin White, Sierra College; Benton Englehart, Diablo Valley College; Justin Andrade, Hartnell College; Benjamin Sarno, Grossmont College; Tyler Brussard, LA Valley College; Bradley Reeves, Ohlone College; Alex Oberle, Ohlone College; Scott Nartker, Diablo Valley College; Kolton Klauer, Hartnell College; Travis Clifton, Hartnell College; Ridge Carpenter, Hartnell College; and Ryan Harmon, Ohlone College.

The future CCCAA Baseball State Championship sites are as follows: 2010 at Fresno City College, 2011 at Bakersfield College, 2012 at Mt. San Antonio College, with a return to Fresno City College in 2013.

Baseball season dates changed and through cost containment (2012) the CCCAA Baseball State Championship will be held the weekend prior to the Memorial Day Weekend. In addition, the game, meet, match may begin date in Bylaw 3.11 received COA Board approval to be changed from January 27 to February 3 to be effective for the 2010, 2011, and 2012 seasons.

3. Men’s Basketball..... Newton Chelette

MC Men’s Basketball Representative Newton Chelette reported concern regarding the cost containment recommendation to host all postconference competition events on campuses where possible. The January 1 effective date may cause problems because the CCCAA Basketball State Championship is held in March, and contracts have already been signed with hotels located near the Cal Luther facility.

4. Women’s Basketball Dan Smith

MC Women’s Basketball Representative Dan Smith voiced the same concerns regarding hotel contracts reported by Newton Chelette regarding the effective date for the cost containment proposal regarding the State Championship site.

CCC Confer will be used to teleconference the next California Community College Women’s Basketball Coaches Association (CCCWBCA) Executive Board meeting.

CCCWBCA President Flo Luppani was commended for developing a program using MS Excel to greatly facilitate the postconference competition seeding process.

5. Cross CountryKulwant Singh

MC Cross Country Representative Kulwant Singh reported that the Cross Country Executive Board met in a joint meeting with Track & Field in July, with nearly 100 percent of its officers attending.

The 2009 CCCAA Cross Country Northern Regional will be November 7 at the Crystal Springs Course in Belmont, hosted by the College of San Mateo. The CCCAA Cross Country Southern Regional will be November 6 at Mt. San Antonio College. The CCCAA Cross Country State Championship will be November 21 at Woodward Park, hosted by Fresno City College.

6. Football John Volek

MC Football Representative John Volek remembered the leadership, dedication, service, and professionalism of Robert Taylor, Santa Monica College; Al Baldock, Taft College and Los Angeles City Colleges; and Clar Appledoorn, Golden Valley Conference Commissioner. All devoted much of their lives to California community college student athletes and the sport of football.

The CCCFCA made its Hall of Fame selections this summer in Visalia. Elected were Brent Carder, Antelope Valley College; Dick Pierucci, Sacramento City College; and Fred Whitmire, College of the Redwoods; Player pre 1975 Bill Baird, College of the Sequoias; Players post 1975 included: Odell Collins, Merced College; Ricky Ray, Shasta College; and Bryan Robinson, College of the Desert; Alumni Player/Coach Bobby Garcia, Gavilan College; Contributor Roger Kelly, College of the Sequoias; Assistant Coach Gene Johnson, Cabrillo College.

MC meeting attendees were reminded of, and encouraged to visit the California Community College Football Coaches Association (CCCFCA) Football Hall of Fame hosted by the Elks Lodge in Visalia, California. The Elks Lodge will also host the CCCFCA Executive Board meeting on Saturday, March 6, 2010.

CCCAA Executive Director was thanked for meeting with CCCFCA leaders Chris Pappas, Jim Sartoris, Gary Kollenborn, John Cicuto, Mark Gritton, John Volek and George Mategakis in an effort to begin working on the CCCFCA cost containment recommendations.

7. Men’s GolfHoward Davis

MC Men’s Golf Representative Howard Davis reported that the May 11, 2009, CCCAA Men’s Golf Championship was hosted by Sierra College at the Sierra View Country Club in Roseville, with Fresno City College winning the title.

The May 17, 2010, CCCAA Men’s Golf Championship will be hosted by Rio Hondo College at the Industry Hills Golf Club.

It was also reported that legislation is in process to clarify the tie-breaking procedure and to permit the use of distance-measuring devices.

8. Women’s Golf.....Dyan Miller

MC Women’s Golf Representative Dyan Miller reported that Santa Barbara City College was crowned the 2008 CCCAA Women’s Golf State Champion, with SBCC Asaka Sim winning the individual state title.

The 2009 CCCAA Women’s Golf State Championship will be hosted by West Hills College-Lemoore at Kings Country Club in Hanford.

The California Community College Ladies Golf Coaches Association (CCCLGCA) has pending legislation to clarify the tie-breaking procedure and to permit the use of distance-measuring devices.

9. SoccerDebbie Cavion

MC Soccer Representative Debbie Cavion reported that the 2009 CCCAA Soccer State Championship will be hosted by Cosumnes River College on December 4-6. Event Manager Liz Belyea was commended for all of the advance preparation she has done to make this event a success.

Those with soccer programs were reminded that the Marymount College soccer teams are club teams, so games contested with Marymount will not be counted in power points—or considered during the seeding process.

10. Softball Jeanne Calamar

MC Softball Representative Jeanne Calamar congratulated Mt. San Antonio College for winning the 2009 CCCAA Softball State Championship.

She participated in a California Community College Fastpitch Coaches Association (3CFCA) teleconference to address cost containment. The 2010 CCCAA Softball State Championship site will be determined after the COA Board makes decisions regarding the MC cost containment recommendations. If format is changed to final four, the state championship will be held at Bakersfield College, and an additional round of regionals, perhaps a supper regional may be needed.

11. Swimming & Diving..... Albert Gasparian

MC Swimming & Diving Representative Albert Gasparian reported that many records were set (including attendance) during the 2009 CCCAA Swimming and Diving State Championship at the Belmont Pool in Long Beach. There is a strong desire on the part of the swimming and diving coaches to keep the championship site at the Belmont Plaza Pool.

The Santa Rosa Jr. College women’s team and the Orange Coast College men’s team were congratulated for their CCCAA Swimming and Diving State Championship titles.

13. Track & FieldJoe Jennum

MC Track & Field Representative Joe Jennum thanked College of San Mateo, Andreas Wolf, and Joe Mangan for hosting an amazing event.

Pam Kelly and Gary Bluth were thanked for working to complete the Form 5 legislation to bring the Track & Field Championship Handbook up to date with current practice. There is also pending legislation that will provide for the best athletes as qualifiers to postconference competition.

The 2010 CCCAA Track and Field State Championship will be hosted by Antelope Valley College: President Jackie Fisher, Sr., and Athletic Director Newton Chelette were thanked for bringing this event to their campus and its brand new facility.

14. Men’s Volleyball.....Clara Lowden

MC Men’s Volleyball Representative congratulated Long Beach City College for winning the 2009 CCCAA Men’s Volleyball Championship contested at Irvine Valley College on April 25. Irvine Valley College was also thanked for hosting the event. The 2010 CCCAA Men’s Volleyball Championship will be hosted by Orange Coast College on May 1, 2010.

The CCCMVCA is working with the COA to get a contract with Mikasa.

Proactive in cost containment, the CCCMVCA has developed schedules and sites to reduce travel and officials’ costs.

The CCCMVCA is also working to update its website.

15. Women’s VolleyballAndreas Wolf

MC Women’s Volleyball Representative Andreas Wolf reported that San Joaquin Delta College Athletic Director Mary Ann Paz has been working with the California Community College Women’s Volleyball Coaches Association (CCCWVCA) and CCCAA Director of Championships via CCC Confer teleconferences to plan for the December 4-6, 2009, CCCAA Women’s Volleyball State Championship to be held at San Joaquin Delta College in Stockton.

The CCCWVCA has pending legislation that will greatly assist the seeding process for women’s volleyball.

George Mategakis was thanked for his hosting of and leadership during the event management teleconferences.

16. Water Polo Kanoe Bandy

MC Water Polo Representative Kanoe Bandy reported that there is a new NCAA rule that requires any athlete with prescription goggles and/or face mask to obtain the signatures of the physician, athletic trainer, athletic director, and conference commissioner on a form that will need to be presented to the official before each contest.

While researching the new NCAA rule on articles that may cause injury, she found that there are actually 65 new NCAA rules governing water polo, and is working to make sure that the athletic directors are informed. Chris Oeding, president of the California Community College Water Polo Coaches Association (CCCWPCA) will disseminate the new rules to the water polo coaches, and Commissioner Rich Kollen will provide the information to conference commissioners.

The 2009 CCCAA Water Polo State Championship will be held November 19-21, hosted by Golden West College in Huntington Beach.

17. Wrestling..... Jim Forkum

MC Wrestling Representative Jim Forkum thanked CCCAA Director of Championships George Mategakis for his work with the California Community College Wrestling Coaches Association (CCCWCA) leadership and the CCCAA State Championship event administration to prepare for the 2009 CCCAA State Championship to be held December 11-12 at Chabot College. Zack Papachristos is the event manager. The 2009 CCCAA Wrestling Northern California Regional will be held on December 5 at Sacramento City College. The 2009 CCCAA Wrestling Southern California Regional will be held on December 5 at East Los Angeles College.

Fresno City College was congratulated for winning the 2008 CCCAA Wrestling State Championship title, and Victor Valley College was thanked for hosting an outstanding event.

The coaches have developed a conferencing proposal for wrestling, as well as a schedule of double duals, both in an attempt to cut travel costs.

H. AFFILIATE ORGANIZATION REPORTS

1. CCCADASusan Yates

MC CCCADA Representative Susan Yates congratulated Deb Blackmore for winning the NATYCA Cup.

Bob Clement is planning the 2010 CCCADA Convention which will be held in conjunction with the National association for athletic directors' convention in Anaheim.

CCCAA staff was thanked for their assistance and the CCCADA is looking forward to the launch of the CCCAA Constitution & Bylaws online exam.

The CCCADA is also involved in cost containment, gender equity, and postconference competition review. The CCCADA is looking forward to the launch of the online exam.

2. 3C4A.....Javier Renteria

MC 3C4A Representative Javier Renteria reported that there are currently four positions open on the 3C4A Executive Board, and they are now accepting nominations for president, vice president (south), secretary, and treasurer.

The 3C4A is currently updating its website so that it will be more user-friendly. It will contain information on best practices and matriculation requirements.

Diane Dickman, NCAA Academic and Membership Affairs, made a presentation to the 3C4A regarding the academic progress of student athletes. We hope to have data available at the CCCAA Annual Convention in the spring.

3. CCCCA Dean Crowley

It was requested that when planning the CCCAA Fall Conference and Annual Convention, MC/4CA summit, 4CA meeting, open forum, and MC meeting be held on one day (or, if not possible, two consecutive days) eliminating the need for coaches to miss three or more days of class to be in attendance.

Legislative item P-12-F09 was discussed and supported, and it was recommended that the deadlines for the student education plans be October 15 for fall sports, including basketball, and March 15 for spring sports. The 4CA has not had an opportunity to discuss these dates with the 3C4A.

5. CCCATARory Natividad

MC CCCATA Representative Rory Natividad congratulated Solano College Athletic Trainer Alison Aubert who received the National Athletic Trainer of the Year award.

The CCCATA has just revised its constitution and is currently working to address athletic trainer visibility at CCCAA postconference competition events.

6. 3CPE.....Kathy McGinnis

MC 3CPE Representative Kathy McGinnis reported that the statewide budget cuts have been the primary focus during this fiscal crisis. The 3CPE has undergone a restructure of its Executive Board and has Kathy McGinnis serving as president, Diane Henry as past president, Rich Schoeder as president elect, Liz Belyea as Treasurer, and Debbie Jensen as Secretary.

7. CCCSIA Jerry Hannula

MC CCCSIA Representative Jerry Hannula reported that the CCCSIA continues with its “Athlete of the Month” award presented to each gender.

Stat Crew program training continues with football and volleyball having received training this fall, and basketball to receive training next month. Baseball and softball Stat Crew training will be offered in the spring.

A CCCSIA representative will be assigned to each sport and will be requested to work with the corresponding coaches association and CCCAA State Championship event manager to cover the event.

The CCCSIA is undergoing an update that will provide an online listing of media connected with each college.

Any college without a sports information person should consider hiring someone to “get their story out.”

I. MANAGEMENT COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS

1. Gender Equity CommitteeDiane Henry

MC Gender Equity Committee Chair Diane Henry reported that there will be a proposed amendment-to-the-amendment made because it has been discovered that CCCApply will not work as intended for the survey of interest of incoming applicants. It was advised that we follow Chabot College and Fresno City College for collecting this data. This survey answers recommendation #10 regarding gender equity. Therefore the committee will make an edit to the proposal and submit it for the amendment-to-the amendment open period.

To address recommendation #11, the Committee will have an EADA Workshop at the CCCAA Annual Convention on how to complete the gender equity survey.

Val Bonnette held a three-day Title 9 workshop this summer and is planning another.

2. Postconference Competition Review Committee Dan Smith

MC Postconference Competition Review Committee Chair Dan Smith reported that the legislative process is going much smoother now that the Competition Committee is filtering the legislation that does not pertain to postconference competition. The committee met on Tuesday evening before the Fall Conference. MC Chair Dave Evans attended to reiterate the charge of the committee.

CCCAA Director of Championships prepared a great and timely report on participating team reimbursement. The next project to be initiated by the committee will be a review of the maximum number allowable for postconference competition travel reimbursement for each sport (maximum travel party size). There is an urgent need to increase the maximum travel party size for reimbursement for soccer from 20 to 25; therefore, we have requested that this be considered as an emergency item.

The approval of the following conference and/or sport rulebook changes was recommended, and:

3. Competition Committee Jim Forkum

MC Competition Committee Chair Jim Forkum thanked the Competition Committee members for their hard work to develop cost containment recommendations which were considered by the MC during its summit on October 27. Following its charge to find ways to cut costs to athletic programs, the Committee understood that tough decisions are going to need to be made. A “big picture” perspective is needed. There are many differences in how budgets are developed from program to program, so not all recommendations will result in cost savings for all programs.

Following much discussion with questions and answers regarding the concerns of specific recommendations, it was MSC (unanimous) to forward the cost containment recommendations to the COA Board as presented.

4. Conferencing Committee..... Dean Crowley

1) Conference #1 Colleges:

Cuyamaca, Grossmont, Imperial Valley, MiraCosta, Palomar, San Diego City, San Diego Mesa, San Diego Miramar, and Southwestern

2) Conference #2 Colleges:

Barstow, Chaffey, **Citrus***, Desert, **Mt. San Antonio***, Mt. San Jacinto, Rio Hondo, **Riverside***, San Bernardino, and Victor Valley

3) Conference #3 Colleges:

Antelope Valley, Canyons, LA Mission, LA Pierce, LA Valley, Moorpark, Oxnard, Santa Barbara, Ventura, and West Los Angeles.

4) Conference #4 Colleges:

Compton*, Cypress, Fullerton, Golden West, Irvine Valley, Orange Coast, Saddleback, Santa Ana, Santiago Canyon

5) Conference #5 Colleges:

Cerritos, East Los Angeles, El Camino, **Glendale***, Long Beach, LA Harbor, LA Southwest, LA Trade Tech, Pasadena, and **Santa Monica***

6) Central Valley Conference Colleges:

Allan Hancock*, **Bakersfield***, **Cuesta***, Fresno, Merced, Porterville, Reedley, Sequoias, Taft, West Hills-Coalinga, and West Hills-Lemoore

7) Independent Colleges:

Cerro Coso*, **LA City***, and **Marymount*** (Marymount has soccer club teams)

This is a cost containment item that, if adopted by the COA Board, would be in effect through 2012. If adopted, divisional structures should be addressed to take into consideration postconference competition seeding issues. Also, if adopted, the Management Council would form a Standing Conferencing Committee to develop conference alignment proposals for after 2012. Central Valley Conference mileage was a major concern of the three colleges moved into that conference through this proposal. The process/advance notification of the proposal and the accuracy of mileage figures used in the proposal were questioned. The effect on long-standing rivalries was a voiced concern.

It was MSC to forward the Northern and Southern Conferencing Committees' proposals to the COA Board for consideration as an emergency item to take effect July 1, 2010. As an emergency item, this will require a $\frac{3}{4}$ vote of approval of the COA Board.
