A. CALL TO ORDER & INTRODUCTIONS Dave Evans

The April 1, 2010, meeting of the CCCAA Management Council was called to order by Chair Dave Evans. C. APPROVAL OF THE OCTOBER 29, 2009, MEETING MINUTES Dave Evans

It was MSC to approve the October 29, 2009, minutes of the CCCAA Management Council meeting.

D. CHAIR UPDATE Dave Evans

Melissa Dawn Johnson of Velvet Suite Marketing met with the CCCAA Management Council in a retreat to provide direction in branding and image development for the CCCAA.

The CCCAA staff: Carlyle Carter, COA Executive Director and CCCAA President/CEO; Debra Wheeler, Director of Membership Services; George Mategakis, Director of Championships; Rina Kasim, Business Operations Specialist; Rima Trotter, Staff Assistant; and Jason Boggs, Assistant Director of Sports Information and Communications; were thanked for their efforts on behalf of the organization. The CCCAA office administered many new firsts this year.

The CCCAA has greatly benefitted from the CCCAA Executive Director's attendance and participation at the NCAA, NATYCA and NACDA meetings.

The Management Council Competition, Gender Equity, and Postconference Competition Review committees were recognized for their hard work on behalf of the CCCAA. The following committee chairs were introduced: Competition Committee Chair Jim Forkum, Gender Equity Committee Chair Diane Henry, and Postconference Competition Review Committee Chair Dan Smith.

A radio broadcast about the NCAA was aired during the meeting. The broadcast reported that the NCAA has stripped scholarships from 17 basketball teams because of poor academic performance of their student athletes in 2006. Last year that number grew to more than 40 teams. According to NCAA research, only half of community college basketball players who transfer to NCAA institutions earn their bachelor's degrees. NCAA colleges are reportedly taking fewer community college transfers to protect their scholarships. The full broadcast may be accessed through:

The new CCCAA Convention Legislative Session process to approve proposed legislation took one and one half hours, which required much less time than the previous process. Having the year to look at and review proposed legislation prior to taking a vote was felt to be more productive. In addition, the new process allows the Management Council more time to address issues and concerns, while placing more responsibility on the CCCAA membership with regard to approving proposed legislation.

The CCCADA officers are looking to the Executive Board, made up of conference representatives, for more voices on issues and decisions.

E. COA BOARD REPORTJackie Fisher, Sr.

Dr. Fisher reported that the COA Board established a Cost Containment and Conferencing Committee chaired by McKinley Williams.

F. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT Carlyle Carter

Executive Director Carter reported a flurry of activity following the State Legislature's attempt to devalue physical education. The legislature has cut community college budgets drastically (\$140 million), pitting department against department as campuses attempt to address that shortfall. Colleges are beginning to drop or suspend sports because of the budget shortfall.

Advocacy on behalf of the CCCAA occurs within the state, as well as nationally at the four-year level within the NCAA. The NCAA is collecting data regarding the academic success of NCAA student athletes, and teams are being given academic progress scores. Lower scores mean fewer opportunities to provide scholarships. Coaches at the four-year level are taking steps to improve their scores, and, in some cases, that means not taking a chance on two-year student athletes who may be highly skilled, but academically questionable.

The CCCAA continues to work with the Two-year Relations Committee and NATYCAA to get CCC student athletes more time for remediation with regard to their participation clock. The Division I Academic Cabinet will be writing legislation related to the data collected by the NCAA. The answer is not additional requirements for eligibility upon transfer.

Significant projects completed this year within the CCCAA office include: the Online Compliance Exam (not to replace the college's compliance workshop); administering the fall CCCAA Conference and Spring Convention; teleconferences with sport coaches association representatives and Management Council sport representatives to plan postconference competition events; updating information on the website—including the conference pages; production of an accurate map depicting CCC district boundaries; and the continued update of the list of high schools within each district (attendees were encouraged to notify staff regarding necessary high school additions/deletions from the lists); continued processing appeals from conference hearing boards through the arbitration panel as needed; meetings with coaches association and conferences upon request; and continuing to provide statistics on the website. There will soon be an infractions report available on the website.

The following nominations from the sport coaches associations through the CCCAA Management Council will be moved forward to the COA Board: Ellen O'Connor, Women's Basketball; Connie Sears, Water Polo; Len Mohny, Baseball; and Mark Gritton, Football. It was noted that there is currently no representation on the CCCAA Management Council from the Golden Valley and Bay Valley conferences.

G. SPORT REPRESENTATIVE REPORTS

1. Badminton Jim Spillers

Badminton is preparing for the 2010 CCCAA Badminton State Championship to be held May 13 (team) and May 14-15 (individual) at Pasadena City College.

2. Baseball Rod Beilby

Paul Moore reported that Management Council Baseball Representative Rod Beilby has not missed a single CCCBCA meeting or state championship during his six-year tenure on the Management Council.

Four pieces of legislation addressing cost containment have been approved by the COA Board. The baseball season was shortened to accommodate a scheduled reduced by eight-games.

Two showcases were held this fall, with one in the north and one in the south.

The 2010 CCCAA Baseball State Championship will be hosted by Fresno City College and held May 21-23. Jerry White will continue as the event manager.

Baseball has changed its Stat Crew reports from once per week last year to now twice per week for non conference games and immediately after every game during conference play. Reports go to the conference statistician.

A new comprehensive umpire evaluation program has been instituted. Each coach is requested to evaluate the umpires after every game. Five statewide coordinators then review the evaluations of umpires and report to the umpires association. If the evaluations indicate that there is a problem with an umpire, then an independent person will go out and observe the situation. Coaches and their teams are also being monitored regarding how they interact with the umpires.

The CCCBCA poll is now being published weekly on the coasports.org website, as well as on SpinCoStats and the ABCA (American Baseball Coaches Association) website.

3. Men's Basketball..... Newton Chelette

Congratulations were extended to Saddleback College for winning the 2010 CCCAA Men's Basketball State Championship.

Next year will see a new format to meet the cost containment mandate for a four-team tournament. This format will include an additional regional round to reduce the field to two teams from the north and two teams from the south progressing to the three-day (Friday–Sunday) state championship.

Legislation to change the basketball season’s begin practice date to October 1 was approved by the CCCAA delegates during the Legislative Session.

4. Women’s Basketball Dan Smith

Congratulations were extended to Ventura College for winning the 2010 CCCAA Women’s Basketball State Championship. The State Championship games had record attendance. The atmosphere was very positive, and Jim Stephens was thanked for his hard work with the tournament.

Legislation was passed regarding the start of season, as mentioned in the men’s basketball report. Legislation was also passed to mandate that statistics be recorded at every women’s basketball game.

The CCCWBCA was thanked for their commitment, organization, and dedication.

Dan Smith was thanked for his six years of service to the CCCAA Management Council.

5. Cross Country Kulwant Singh

The 2009 CCCAA Cross Country State Championships were held Saturday, November 21, at Woodward Park, hosted by Fresno City College. George Mategakis, Pam Kelley, and Gary Bluth were thanked for their hard work to make the State Championship a success.

There were 199 women participants in the 5K race. Nina Moore of Glendale College won the individual title, and Glendale College won the team championship.

The men’s race is a four-mile event that had 219 men participating. Daniel Tapia of Hartnell College won the individual title, and San Bernardino Valley College won the team championship.

Legislation was approved to clean up the championship selection process.

6. Football John Volek

John Volek stated that it has been a pleasure to serve for three years as the football representative. Mark Gritton, Joe Early, and Tom Gang were thanked for the work they did during their presidencies of the CCCFCA. Larry Reisbig, Jim Sartoris, Gary Kollenborn, and Chris Pappas also give much to the sport of football.

The CCCFCA was given the task of addressing cost containment. The CCCFCA voted to continue no scrimmage and no out of season participation, modify the Southern California football playoffs to four teams, and continue to freeze pay to officials. The coaches have voted to implement a new game exchange program, utilizing internet technology to exchange films for free. Scheduling in the north was accomplished with strong geographic consideration, reducing travel by 6,500 miles. The SCFA voted for a 10 percent reduction in conference dues.

The north will be starting its season one week later, with no bye week, so that the season will end in alignment with the South.

The CCCAA Football State Championship site is now rotating between the north and south so that only one team will have to travel. In addition, the CCCFCA will meet at the site of the State Championship.

The 2009 CCCAA Football State Championship was hosted by College of San Mateo. The College of San Mateo and the Mt. San Antonio coaches were congratulated for great play. Andreas Wolf, George Mategakis, Jason Boggs, Fred Baer, Matt Folsom, Mike Taylor, Mark Gritton, John Early, and Carlyle Carter did an outstanding job with event management.

The CCCFCA Hall of Fame inductees included: Fred Myer, Brent Carder, Odell Collins, Gene Johnson, Bobby Garcia, Richard Pierucci, Bill Baird, and Roger Kelly.

The CCCFCA withdrew its legislation (P-18-F09 and P-19-F09).

The CCCFCA requests that the athletic directors and conference commissioners develop a method to protect them from students coming to football programs with forged transcripts.

7. Men's GolfHoward Davis

The 2010 Men's Golf State Championship will be held on May 17, at the Oak Valley Golf Club in Beaumont California.

The Northern CCCMGCA president Tim Hovancsek (Sierra College) suffered an aortic aneurysm on the golf course during a match. Assistant San Joaquin Delta College coach and retired Stockton firefighter Roger Gray and Santa Rosa Jr. College student athlete Al Garcia, who had recently taken an emergency medical technician course at Solano College, started CPR and are credited with helping to save his life. Coach Hovancsek was recently released from the hospital, and he is reported to be doing well. Coach Hovancsek was among the one percent who survive this type of aneurysm.

8. Women's Golf.....Dyan Miller

Howard Davis reported that the 2009 CCCAA Women's Golf State Championship (team) was won by Sacramento City College. The Individual Champion was Lynne Cowan from Sierra College. Congratulations to Sacramento City College—the first Northern California team to win the CCCAA Women's Golf State Championship title!

The proposed legislation revising the tie-breaking procedures for men's golf and for women's golf was passed by the CCCAA delegates.

9. Soccer Debbie Cavion

Debbie Cavion thanked Liz Belyea for hosting the 2009 CCCAA Soccer State Championship at Cosumnes River College. Congratulations were extended to Santiago Canyon College women's team and the Mt. San Antonio Men's team.

The CCCSCA is looking at power points awarded for home and away games vs. those at neutral sites and how forfeitures will affect the power rating calculation. A power point structure proposal may come forward next year. The CCCSCA Executive Board will meet May 6.

10. Softball Jeanne Calamar

Softball had four pieces of legislation that were approved in the fall. Softball changed its state championship format from an eight-team to a four-team, double elimination format to meet the cost containment mandates. 3CFCA Co Presidents Darci Brownell and Stephanie Reynolds were thanked for their work in adjusting the format.

Bakersfield College will host the 2010 CCCAA Softball State Championship to be held May 14-16. Because of the cost containment format changes, format and dates for the regional competition have been changed as follows: The regional format will include a first regional round which will be a best-of-three series at the higher seeds to be held May 1–2. The winners will progress to the super regional (2nd) round double-elimination tournament on May 7–9 including four teams at each of four sites (two in the north and two in the south). The winners of each of the four super regional tournaments will advance to the CCCAA State Championship.

George Mategakis was thanked for setting up teleconferences for state championship planning.

11. Swimming Albert Gasparian

The 2010 CCCAA Swimming & Diving State Championships will be held April 29-May 1 at Mt. San Antonio College. Teleconferences are being held to plan the event. George Mategakis, CCCSDCA President Jill McCormick, and Marc Ruh were thanked for their involvement in planning the event.

Coaches are reminded that the sports of swimming and diving follow the NCAA rulebook and that there is a new NCAA rule regarding swimsuits.

12. TennisJeff Nelson

Jean Snuggs and American River College were thanked for hosting a great 2009 Men & Women’s Tennis State Championship. The College of the Desert Women’s Team defeated Sierra College, and the College of the Desert Men’s Team defeated Fresno City College to win the CCCAA Tennis State Championship titles.

The 2010 CCCAA Tennis Regional competition will be held as follows:

- Northern California Men and Women’s Individual and Dual Team: April 28–May 1, Santa Rosa Jr. College
- Southern California Men & Women’s Dual Team: April 28 at higher seed;
- Southern California Men’s Individual: April 29-May 1 at California State University, Northridge;
- Southern California Women’s Individual: April 29–May 1 at Long Beach City College

The 2010 CCCAA Men & Women’s Tennis State Championship will be held at the Balboa Bay Club in Newport Beach May 6–8. Diane Henry and Jeff Benito of Cypress College were thanked for their efforts to plan and host the 2010 state championship. George Mategakis was also thanked for his leadership in planning the postconference competition events.

13. Track & FieldJoe Jennum

The track coaches have used the legislative process to improve and update the CCCAA Track & Field Championship Handbook with regard to incorporating their regional rules, rules changes, and clarification regarding state championship qualifiers.

Track & field will now focus on the unattached rule to clarify intent, discuss dates for heptathlon/decathlon events, and the ever-increasing costs for Southern California officials. The coaches association will be looking for an interpretation of recent changes to Bylaw 7 which prohibits coaches associations from purchasing additional awards that seems to be in conflict with the bylaw that allows coaches associations to purchase non-approved awards.

Coaches association thanked Gary Bluth, Joe Mangan, and Mark Covert, for their hard work on behalf of track & field.

Dates and sites for upcoming 2010 CCCAA postconference competition events include:

- Northern California
 - Heptathlon/Decathlon–American River College, April 20-21
 - Trials–American River College, May 7
 - Finals–American River College, May 14

- Southern California
 - Heptathlon/Decathlon–Cerritos College, April 13-14
 - Trials–Saddleback College, May 8
 - Finals–Saddleback College, May 15

- CCCAA Track & Field State Championship at Antelope Valley College May 21-22.

A tremendous amount of work is required to host these events, and all involved are greatly appreciated.

Legislation was approved by the CCCAA delegates increasing opportunities for student athletes to participate in special events and providing clarification of state championship qualifiers (automatic qualifying and minimum standards).

14. Men’s Volleyball.....Clara Lowden

The 2010 CCCAA Men’s Volleyball State Championship will be hosted by Orange Coast College on April 22-24.

The CCCMVCA will meet April 17 to discuss concerns and develop legislation to be submitted in the fall.

The All Conference Academic Team Award is a new award to be presented by the CCCMVCA. The association is also working to develop a website which should be completed soon.

George Mategakis was thanked for his leadership in hosting teleconferences to plan the postconference competition events.

15. Women’s VolleyballAndreas Wolf

The 2009 CCCAA Women’s Volleyball State Championship was hosted by San Joaquin Delta College. Mary Ann Paz, Laurie Nash, and Kanoe Bandy were all thanked for their efforts. Congratulations were extended to Orange Coast College for winning the CCCAA State Championship title.

The CCCWVCA provided a proposal to meet the cost containment mandate to limit state championships to four teams.

The CCCWVCA voted to change its seeding date from Saturday to Sunday. The CCCAA was thanked for supporting the postconference competition events.

The 2010 Women's Volleyball State Championship will be hosted by the Foothill Athletic Conference at Chaffey College on December 4-5.

16. Water Polo Kanoë Bandy

Water Polo has submitted a proposed format to meet the cost containment mandate.

Albert Gasparian was thanked for hosting the 2009 CCCAA Water Polo State Championship at Golden West College.

Pete Snyder, Scott Decker, and Chris Oeding were thanked for their leadership in the CCCWPCA. Debra Wheeler was thanked for her assistance in developing legislation on behalf of water polo.

Kanoë Bandy was thanked for her six years of service on the CCCAA Management Council.

17. Wrestling..... Jim Forkum

Thanks were extended to: Larry Watanabe of Mt. San Antonio College for his leadership of the CCCWCA; George Mategakis for hosting teleconferences to plan the 2009 CCCAA Wrestling State Championship; and Chabot College, Don Queyrel, and his staff for hosting the 2009 CCCAA Wrestling State Championship. Congratulations were extended to Santa Ana College for winning the state championship title.

Management Council Wrestling Representative Jim Forkum met three times with the CCCWCA and will meet in May with wrestling conference commissioners to review conference constitutions and schedule planning. No new legislation is anticipated.

H. AFFILIATE ORGANIZATION REPORTS

1. CCCADASusan Yates

Bob Clement was thanked for organizing ten teleconferences for organizational meetings of the CCCADA–minutes of those meetings are posted on the CCCADA website. The CCCADA is making an effort to post everything on its website.

The Executive Officers of the Athletic Directors Association are working more closely with the conference representatives in recommendations and decisions of the Athletic Directors Association. There is a continued practice of including conference commissioners in all CCCADA activities, and commissioners are always invited to CCCADA events.

It was announced that Barbara Bond, Orange Coast College, is retiring after 38 years of service to student athletes. Deb Blackmore is retiring after 37 years at Mt. San Antonio College.

As of the fall, not including basketball, Mt. San Antonio College is in the lead for the NATYCAA Cup.

Andreas Wolf, College of San Mateo, and Jim Forkum, Santa Rosa Jr. College, have provided athletic directors with a model to be used by athletic directors in presentations to their boards.

The CCCADA is very pleased with the leadership and direction of the COA/CCCAA office.

2. 3C4A.....Javier Renteria

Dan Smith, John Volek, and Kanoe Bandy were thanked for their service to, and for their mentoring new members of, the CCCAA Management Council.

Mt. San Antonio College and the 3C4A are hosting the Region 5 Conference with the Four-year Academic Advisors. All were invited to attend the N4A Conference which will include discussions on transfer requirements to Division I, II, III, and NAIA colleges. The Region 5 Conference information will be sent to the 3C4A membership.

The 3C4A has elected Evans Roderick to continue as president. Javier Renteria, Reedley College, is the northern vice president; Michael Rios, Antelope Valley College, is the southern vice president; Shane Poulter, Mt. San Antonio, is the treasurer; and Traci Franks, Moorpark College, is the secretary.

3. CCCCA Dean Crowley

The conference commissioners held a three-hour workshop on Article 7 regarding sanctions and appeals so that commissioners can be consistent when dealing with infractions. Dale and Logan were thanked for their leadership, COA Board Chair Jackie Fisher, Sr., was thanked for his attendance at the workshop. Carlyle Carter was thanked for his communication and direction.

Dean was thanked for his three years of service on the CCCAA Management Council. Gary Kollenborn is the incoming Management Council member serving from the CCCCA.

4. 4CA.....Terry Coblentz/Paul Moore

Pete Snyder, 4CA past president, was thanked for his leadership of the 4CA. Terry Coblentz was also thanked for her service as the 4CA Management Council Representative on an interim basis. Paul Moore is now the 4CA president, and Flo Lupani is serving as vice president.

Legislation will be proposed which will make it possible for spring sport athletes to be eligible for all-academic awards while they are still at the community colleges.

A Code of Ethics was approved by the 4CA Board, which will go out to the field for ratification and then be put on the 4CA agenda for adoption next May.

The 4CA membership voiced disappointment that it did not have an active part in the development of the conferencing proposals.

Terry Coblenz commended the coaches association presidents for stepping up and attending and participating in meetings of the 4CA.

5. CCCATARory Natividad

The CCCATA met yesterday. An online survey will be used as a tool to further athletic training services.

It was noted that athletic trainer supplies will be impacted by the legislation approved to lengthen the basketball season.

6. 3CPE.....Kathy McGinnis

Diane Henry reported that Bob Campbell, political advocate, spoke to the 3CPE on the state budget. He made the recommendation that the 3CPE membership be proactive in addressing these issues within their campuses and that they be vigilant in their academic senates in order to protect the physical education curriculum.

A report of the 3CPE action included:

The treasurer's report from Liz Belyea indicated a balance in the 3CPE budget of \$16,000.

Secretary Debbie Jensen, Cerritos College, will produce a 3CPE newsletter and is requesting that items for inclusion be sent to her.

The association reviewed and adopted changes to the 3CPE Constitution and next will review the 3CPE Mission Statement.

Minimum qualifications and "SLOs" were discussed. Debbie Jensen provided a demonstration on promoting a "PE Revolution" which is an on-campus activity.

The 3CPE is soliciting Honoring Our Own candidates. Due January 15, the nominations can be submitted early.

7. CCCSIAJerry Hannula

The sports information association continues to work with CCCAA to staff each CCCAA state championship event and the NATYCAA Cup standings.

The sports information directors may be a major force in branding the CCCAA.

To promote student athletes, the CCCSIA administers the athlete-of-the-month program and may add an athlete-of-the-year award (one male and one female from both north and south).

A fact sheet is being prepared to be posted on the CCCSIA website to show how colleges can live stream video of athletic events.

The CCCSIA meets twice a year—in the spring and in the summer. This spring, the CCCSIA met in conjunction with the CCCAA Basketball State Championship.

Robert Lewis, Pasadena City College, and Jerry Hannula, Saddleback College, will make a presentation of the importance of having a sports information director at the CCCPRO (public relations officers) Conference in Santa Barbara.

Tony Altobelli, Orange Coast College, is the incoming CCCSIA president.

I. MANAGEMENT COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS

1. Competition Committee Jim Forkum

Competition Committee Chair Jim Forkum introduced the Competition Committee members: McKinley Williams, Contra Costa College; John Keever, Orange Empire Conference; Jeanne Calamar, Cosumnes River College; Paul Moore, 4CA; Ron Hannon, Gavilan College; Mary Ann Paz, San Joaquin Delta College; Rory Natividad, Rio Hondo College; Jerry Hannula, Saddleback College; Clara Lowden, Riverside City College; Joe Jennum, Mt. San Antonio College; and Barbara Bond, Orange Coast College. Barbara Bond is retiring, and therefore, a female from the south will be needed on the committee.

The Committee has had its focus on cost containment. Coaches have taken a lead to cut costs, and thereby serve as a model for other college departments.

Wrestling has worked to take cost containment action by geographical conferencing to reduce travel costs, scheduling dual meets on Fridays, scheduling double duals (meets that include three colleges thereby reducing the number of trips), squad sizes are limited to 20 wrestlers and 2 coaches, and a number of schools have instituted a travel limit, with no district funds allotted to overnight trips. These recommendations will go to the COA Board Cost Containment Committee.

Football has developed a comprehensive list of recommendations reported earlier by John Volek. Those recommendations will also be going to the COA Board Cost Containment Committee.

The cost containment action will be reviewed, and additional cost containment recommendations will be provided in the fall.

2. Gender Equity CommitteeDiane Henry

The Gender Equity Committee and Dr. Long Nguyen were thanked for their work on the legislation regarding the FORM R4. The legislation was nearly unanimously approved by the delegates at the Legislative Session. A workshop on the FORM R4 process will be conducted June 23, 2010, at the CCCADA meeting in conjunction with NATYCAA.

CalNOW has announced that it is turning its focus to community colleges. The membership is currently following the 2004 CPEC recommendations to conduct surveys of student interest, to provide gender equity training, and to complete a survey of EADA reports regarding hiring practices.

Cypress College has already received 1,600 responses to a survey sent out just 29 days ago, with 111 women interested in badminton and 64 interested in golf.

3. Postconference Competition Review Committee Dan Smith

The Postconference Competition Review Committee members were named by Chair Dan Smith: Kanoe Bandy, Rod Beilby, Jeanne Calamar, Mitch Campbell, Newton Chelette, Tim Harrison, and Connie Sears. PCRC members who have completed six years of service on the CCCAA Management Council are: Kanoe Bandy, Rod Beilby, and PCRC Chair Dan Smith.

The PCRC met Monday evening to review proposals from men's basketball, women's basketball, volleyball, and water polo to meet the cost containment mandate to restrict state championships to four teams. The recommendations will go forward to the COA Board's Cost Containment Committee.

The PCRC recommendation is to accept the cost containment proposals for women's volleyball and water polo.

The PCRC recommends approval of the proposed men's basketball regional format.

The PCRC recommends that the women's basketball regional format follow the format of the men's basketball regionals to reduce travel and increase gate receipts.

The PCRC recommends that the CCCAA Basketball State Championship eliminate afternoon games and that games be held on Friday and Saturday evenings (days alternating by gender, starting with men's games on Friday) with Sunday game times to remain as they are currently listed in the Basketball Championship Handbook.

Both men's basketball and women's basketball want to be together at the state championship. Women's basketball requested that the site be kept at Cal Lutheran. Men's Basketball did not make the same request. Therefore, the PCRC recommends that the CCCAA Basketball State Championship games be on campus. Both basketball coaches association will review possible host sites and look for a college suitable for the event.

It was MSC (unanimous) to endorse the Postconference Competition Review Committee report as stated.

Individual sports need to be reviewed, regarding whether or not they need a reduction in postconference competition as well.

4. Formation of Bylaw 2 Review Committee

It was MSC to form a “Bylaw 2 Review Committee” with Newton Chelette as chair. Members include Dale Murray, John Keever, Susan Yates, Jeanne Calamar, Howard Davis, and Rory Natividad.

Items for the committee to consider will include:

- Being able to wear college attire with logo throughout the state,
- Technology/website administration,
- Try outs,
- Statewide recruiting, and
- Worldwide recruiting.

Newton Chelette stated that a simple yes/no survey covering the above topics will be developed and will be sent to athletic directors.

J. LEGISLATIVE ITEMS

Legislative items were removed from the agenda because delegates had already voted on the items during the Legislative Session held previous to the Management Council meeting.

2. Discussion: CCCAA Management Council Business Meeting Agenda, Timing vs. Legislative Session

A review is needed regarding the CCCAA Convention schedule to improve attendance at the Honoring our Own Banquet, as well as reduce the repetition of reports. In addition, it was felt that the Management Council should meet prior to Legislative Session. The decreased attendance at the Hall-of-Fame Banquet was also noted.

3. NATYCA Golf Tournament

John Volek will be sending an email requesting information needed to plan the NATYCAA Golf Tournament.

4. Transcript verification will be an item on the next CCCAA Management Council meeting agenda.
