ENTRY DEADLINE: Coaches of qualifying teams and individual players must forward rosters to the tournament director no later than **5:00 p.m.** on **Wednesday, May 7.**

REGISTRATION AND FEES:

Registration of all players shall take place at the SCGA Golf Club on **Sunday, May 11,** between the hours of **5:00 and 7:30 p.m.**

The Tournament participation fees are **\$60 per player** or **\$360 per 6-man team,** including lunch and range balls on the day of competition (please make checks payable to *Palomar College Athletics*).

COMPETITION FORMAT:

Twenty (20) groups of three (3), will start from tees 1 and 10 using consecutive times beginning at **8:06 a.m.** A schedule of pairings and starting times will be made available to *coaches only* upon registration. The afternoon round will begin at **12:45 p.m.**

PLAYING RULES:

CCCAA post-conference competition shall be played under United States Golf Association (USGA) rules and local course rules. Also:

- Electronic Measuring Devices are prohibited.
- The “One-Ball Rule” is not in effect.

MANDATORY SUPERVISION:

Regional and state participants shall be accompanied and supervised throughout the competition by an employee from the college. Lacking this supervision, participation shall be denied.

PRACTICE:

No practice or competition rounds of golf shall be played on courses to be used for the season’s regional or state competition during the two (2) full weeks prior to the event(s), except for the home team which uses the course for its practice. A golf course consists of holes 1 through 18. Individuals who violate this provision shall be disqualified from all or any further play. Violators found after the completion of competition shall be declared ineligible and their participation shall be forfeited.

COURSE WALK-AROUND:

The course will be made available for a coach and participant “walk-around” on **Sunday, May 11**, between the hours of **5:00 and 7:30 p.m.** All players must be accompanied by their coach and appear in team uniform to participate in the walk-around.

REQUIRED DRESS:

Participants shall dress in long-legged slacks or solid-colored shorts, according to course regulation, and shirts with a collar. Shirts must be tucked in to pants at all times. This regulation includes both the walk-around and competition.

OFFICIAL STARTERS CLOCK:

The official tournament starting clock will be located at the 1st and 10th tee boxes.

ADVICE:

Only the head coach or his/her designee may confer with his/her own player(s), only to the extent he/she not interfere with the other players in the tournament.

PROTEST:

A protest and rules committee shall consist of the host pro or USGA official and the president and president-elect of the CCCGCA. The event manager shall fill vacancies to this committee by appointment at a coaches informational meeting prior to the tournament.

TIES:

When a tie occurs, the winner shall be determined as follows:

1. TEAM TIES—As time and conditions permit, a 1-to-3 hole playoff will be held calculating the five (5) best scores after each hole. If the tie continues, the scorecards of the best 5-of-6 players on each tied team or tied individuals will be “matched” using the USGA rules listed below:
 - a. Those tied shall compare the best scores recorded on the back nine (9) holes played by only those five (5) whose scores created the tie.
 - b. When tied players have the same score for the back nine (9), the winner shall be determined by comparing the scores on the last six (6) holes, the last three (3) holes, and finally the 18th hole.
2. INDIVIDUAL TIES—As in team ties, a 1-to-3 hole sudden death playoff will be held when possible. Should a tie still exist following the third hole, the tie-breaking process is determined by matching scorecards under 1a and 1b above.
3. PROCEDURES FOR CONDUCTING PLAYOFFS—See Supplement Appendix B, Suggested Procedures for Conducting Team and Individual Playoff Ties.

SUBSTITUTIONS:

Following the start of competition, there shall be no substitutions.

CARTS:

Each designated coach, from a school that has a team/individual(s) participating will have access to one (1) cart. Carts will not be made available for spectators at any time.

SPECTATORS:

Spectators will be allowed on the course to observe the competition. They will be restricted to cart paths or in areas considered to be the rough. At no time are spectators permitted to walk or talk with the competitors during the periods of competition. All spectators must also follow the club’s dress policy. Carts will not be made available for spectators at any time.

COACHES MEETING:

All coaches will meet after all the players have teed off for the first round of play. The meeting will begin promptly at 9:30 a.m. in the SCGA Clubhouse Restaurant.

DRIVING RANGE:

The driving range opens at 7:00 a.m. on the date of competition. Balls will be provided for teams and individual players. The driving range will be divided into locations for each team, as well as individuals to hit balls.

DIRECTIONS TO THE SCGA GOLF COURSE

From North

I-15: Exit Winchester Road, go east (left). Continue approximately 3 miles on Winchester Road. Turn North (left) on Robert Trent Jones Parkway. At the Stop sign, turn right to the Clubhouse.

I-215: Take Murrieta Hot Springs Road exit, go east (left). Continue approximately 3 miles on Murrieta Hot Springs Road. At Winchester Road, turn left onto Winchester Road. Turn east (left) onto Robert Trent Jones Parkway, at the Stop sign, turn right to Clubhouse.

From South

I-15: Exit Winchester Road, go east (right). Continue approximately 3 miles on Winchester Road. Turn North (left) on Robert Trent Jones Parkway. At the Stop sign, turn right to the Clubhouse.



THE SCGA COURSE HOLE-BY-HOLE



Hole 1

Par 5, 565/545/514/473 yards; Men's Hdcp 9, Ladies' Hdcp 1 A good starting hole. Position tee shot left of fairway bunker for a flat lie. Check yardage for lay up to avoid getting hung up on the down hill slope. Long hitters beware of out-of-bounds on the left.



Hole 2

Par 3, 185/174/146/113 yards; Men's Hdcp 13, Ladies' Hdcp 17 Your tee shot must carry over a hollow in order to reach the green. Better a little long, as the front of this green won't hold. Check the prevailing wind.



Hole 3

Par 4, 413/387/372/213 yards; Men's Hdcp 3, Ladies' Hdcp 11 Perhaps the most beautiful and interesting hole on the course - boy, what a view! Tees are elevated with a drop of more than 100 feet to the fairway. Trees left and water right make this a tough hole.



Hole 4

Par 5, 553/539/527/426 yards; Men's Hdcp 7, Ladies' Hdcp 9 Just a good, solid par-five hole. The fairway is slightly uphill, guarded by bunkers left and right. The green also has bunkers left and right. 5 is a good score here.



Hole 5

Par 4, 428/420/392/351 yards; Men's Hdcp 5, Ladies' Hdcp 3 Slight dogleg left and you can't see the green until your second shot. Hit your tee shot a little left of center because the fairway slants left to right and you'll get more run on your tee shot.



Hole 6

Par 3, 167/160/144/110 yards; Men's Hdcp 17 Ladies' Hdcp 13 Shortest par three on the course. Stay below the hole for easiest putt.

SCGA COURSE HOLE-BY-HOLE



Hole 7

Par 4, 348/324/309/280 yards; Men's Hdcp 15, Ladies' Hdcp 7 Don't be deceived by the length of this par 4. It is all up hill. Aim tee shot for right side of fairway, the severe bunker guards best angle for approach shot.



Hole 8

Par 4, 431/400/387/299 yards; Men's Hdcp 1, Ladies' Hdcp 5 Position tee shot on right side of fairway for best angle of approach. On your approach, pay close attention to the hole location on this severe two level green.



Hole 9

Par 4, 391/363/343/303 yards; Men's Hdcp 11, Ladies' Hdcp 15 Position tee shot on left side of the fairway. Take enough club to avoid severe bunkers in front of this elevated green.



Hole 10

Par 3, 201/191/135/102 yards; Men's Hdcp 12, Ladies' Hdcp 18 This long par 3 will penalize a short tee shot. Notice drop area adjacent to red tees. Favor right side of green for best chance at par.



Hole 11

Par 4, 406/380/369/348 yards; Men's Hdcp 10, Ladies' Hdcp 4 Aim drive at the right edge of furthest left bunker. Long hitters should aim at left edge of right bunkers. The approach is uphill to a large green. Black pin position will require an extra club.



Hole 12

Par 4, 419/411/377/367 yards; Men's Hdcp 2, Ladies' Hdcp 6 Water down the left and both fairway bunkers require a well planned tee shot. Better to be long on the approach to avoid deep bunkers guarding this green.

SCGA COURSE HOLE-BY-HOLE



Hole 13

Par 5, 586/558/538/483 yards; Men's Hdcp 8, Ladies' Hdcp 2 Position tee shot and second shot on the left side of the fairway. This green is the deepest on the course. Check hole location. Favor the right side of the green.



Hole 14

Par 4, 427/408/398/318 yards; Men's Hdcp 6, Ladies' Hdcp 8 For most players, aim tee shot at the bunker through the center of the fairway. Longer hitters should aim right of it. Better to be long to avoid greenside bunkers.



Hole 15

Par 4, 351/343/319/277 yards; Men's Hdcp 18, Ladies' Hdcp 16 Prevailing headwind makes this par 4 deceptively longer. Aim tee shot left of horseshoe bunker for widest landing area. Be aggressive on this approach and you will be rewarded.



Hole 16

Par 3, 205/189/164/155 yards; Men's Hdcp 14, Ladies' Hdcp 16 With this deep green, check hole location and prevailing tailwind. With no wind take at least one more club for back hole locations.



Hole 17

Par 5, 515/499/459/429 yards; Men's Hdcp 16, Ladies' Hdcp 12 Keep drive on left side of fairway for the best chance at this reachable par 5. Position lay up shot on the left side of the fairway for best angle or go for the green if bunkers don't scare you.



Hole 18

Par 4, 445/411/401/307n yards; Men's Hdcp 4, Ladies' Hdcp 10 Aim tee shot at right edge of left bunker. This long up hill par 4 will require at least one extra club. Back hole locations are on the upper level of this 2 tiered green. Robert Trent Jones, Sr. does not give away birdies!
